

# BURCHETTS GREEN CE INFANT SCHOOL

## School Uniform

Children are expected to wear school uniform. It makes them more conscious of their school membership and the standards of behaviour expected of them. The following items make up the standard school dress to be worn throughout the year:

- Purple V-necked jumper or cardigan bearing school embroidered logo
  - White shirt or blouse (long or short sleeved)
  - School Tie (with white shirt) optional
  - Grey trousers/shorts or School's tartan skirt/pinafore dress
  - Purple/white check dress (summer)
  - Grey socks (with trousers/shorts)
  - Plain grey tights (with pinafore/skirt)
  - White socks (with purple/white check dress (summer)
  - Black shoes or sandals (not opened toed)
  - One piece swimming costume or swimming trunks (not board shorts) and children with longer hair are required to wear a swimming hat.

- Clothing items bearing the school logo are available for purchase from Goyals, Maidenhead.
  - Bookbags, water bottles and ties can be purchased from the school office.
  - All long hair must be tied back.
  - Children will also require black shorts, a purple polo shirt with embroidered logo and trainers for P.E., as well as a large shoe bag to keep their PE Kit in. All children also need a pair of wellingtons at school.
  - A school jog suit (purple top with embroidered logo and black joggers) is needed for outdoor games in winter and to wear to school after swimming.
  - A purple fleece or purple reversible fleece/jacket can also be purchased for use after swimming, as a light coat, or an extra layer for sports activities during the winter
  - So that children may be encouraged to become independent, parents are requested to provide ties on elastic and sensible shoes with velcro fastenings or buckles until the child can fasten their own laces.

**All items should be clearly marked with the child's name.**

### VALUABLES

It should be understood that neither ODST nor the school can accept responsibility for pupils' personal property being lost, damaged or stolen. For this reason, and for safety and appearance, jewellery must not be worn to school. Children with pierced ears may wear stud earrings only but it is preferable that these are removed (or taped up) on P.E. days and removed for swimming.
