

Communication and Language

- Develop listening skills in a range of situations - carpet, outdoor playing, crossing the road for woodland walk
- Develop language and vocabulary to imagine and recreate roles and experiences in home role play areas
- Initial teacher assessments for home reading program

Physical Development

- Explore range of climbing, balancing and sliding apparatus, wheeled toys, bats and balls, hoops etc. in the outside area
- Make healthy snack and lunch choices and develop understanding of lunchtime routines
- Sports and football sessions
- Changing for PE
- Letter formation - sand/ water writing
- Clay and playdough owls - fine motor skills

Understanding the World

- Participate in class discussion about family holidays
- Learning about Harvest around the world
- Owl life cycles
- Exploring our local woodland area
- Learning about different birds in our habitat

Expressive Arts and Design

- Paint portraits of ourselves, families, and class friends
- Listen to and participate in daily music activities singing familiar songs and rhymes
- Owl crafts - 3D feathered owls, twig nests, split pin hatching, biscuit designs
- Role play owl stories

- Become familiar with routines and rules of the class and school

Mathematics

- Participate in daily calendar activities; using mathematical language for time
- Recognise, create and extend patterns using 2D shapes
- Counting and recognizing numbers of personal significance
- Counting and sorting owls
