

Communication and Language

- Develop listening skills in a range of situations
- Develop language and vocabulary to imagine and recreate roles and experiences comparing olden and new
- Show & Tell - sharing experiences and special things with classmates

Physical Development

- Explore range of climbing, balancing and sliding apparatus, wheeled toys, bats and balls, hoops etc. in the outside area
- Explore how to stay safe in the classroom and in our surroundings
- Develop fine motor skills for writing letters
- Using equipment safely to create Victorian replica models

Understanding the World

- Discuss how Christmas and other Winter festivals are celebrated across the world
- Explore creatures in our habitat and their behavior in Winter
- Remembrance Day
- Children in Need and Christmas shoeboxes - talk about how we can help others in the world with different needs

Expressive Arts and Design

- Fireworks pictures
- Remembrance Day Poppies
- Christmas tree ornaments
- Nativity performance - singing and acting

- Participate in daily calendar activities, focusing on days of the week
- Learning about 3D shapes around us
- Coin recognition; using in role play shop
- Develop written number formation
- Measuring length in non-standard units

- Write own name and other things such as labels or captions
- Use phonic knowledge to decode regular words and read them aloud accurately, and demonstrate understanding when talking with others about what they have read.
